A St. John's Heritage Moment

St. John's 125th Anniversary Year - Doing God's Love for 125 Years

While St. John's Anglican Church is celebrating 125 years of service and worship in North Vancouver, we mentioned recently our current building was built in 1987.

On February 8th, 1985, our minister Reverend Murrin and the two church wardens were awakened in the middle of the night by local authorities. The 75-year old church building had been destroyed by fire. While firefighters continued to bring the conflagration under control, parishioners pulled out any items they could salvage, taking them to the church hall to be cleaned and sorted. Ian McMordie and Ken Jeanes led a team who worked through the day and into the night, pulling out records, plagues, and anything of value that could be salvaged.

A prayer service was held that evening in the Memorial Hall (this was before the building was converted into a daycare), which soon became the temporary sanctuary. On Sunday morning, the hall was overflowing with parishioners, neighbours, and representatives of the deanery. Almost everyone wept as the congregation sang "Now Thank We All Our God", signalling the determination to carry on stronger than ever as the parish of St. John the Evangelist Anglican Church.
